#### **FIELD TRIPS**

In 2019 VMware welcomed over 115 first year BIS students to its Ballincollig Offices. Students were treated to a host of inspiring VMware speakers and a mindfulness session. The guest panel Q&A session included CIT BIS graduates who are now employees of VMware. Students are also part of the VMware STEM Aspire programme for mentoring female STEM students.

#### **GUEST LECTURES**

The BIS programme places a strong emphasis on guest lectures from industry experts. Each year speakers from VMware share their educational background, career paths and explain their current roles and responsibilities within their organisation.

These have included John Ryan, Systems Engineering Manager talking on emerging technologies; Mairead O'Flynn, University Campus Manager speaking on Career Options and Gerry Murphy, Senior Program Manager speaking to the Project Management class.

## PLACEMENT AND GRADUATE RECRUITMENT

Some CIT BIS placement students spend 6 months in VMware working closely with customers and taking VMware certification exams in the third year of their programme. VMware also recruits CIT BIS students on to their graduate programme.

### **ASSESSMENT**

These interactive activities with VMware also have a practical element. BIS student groups are required to undertake written assignments based on field trips, presentations and work placement - forming part of their module assessments.
